Definitions of QUAD A Dental Facility Classes

Class A:

In a Class A Facility, dental and/or pain management procedures may be performed under:

- 1. Topical anesthesia and/or
- 2. Local anesthesia

Class A facilities must meet all Class A standards.

Class B:

In a Class B facility, dental and/or pain management procedures are performed in the facility under:

- 1. Local and/or
- 2. Topical anesthesia
- 3. Intravenous anesthesia, and/or inhalation agents (including nitrous oxide).
- 4. Parenteral sedation

These agents may be administered by a qualified dentist or physician, a Registered Nurse Anesthetist, and Anesthetist, an Anesthesia Assistant, under direct supervision of an anesthesiologist, or by Register Nurse under supervision of a qualified physician.

Class B facilities must meet all Class A and Class B standards.

Class C:

In a Class C facility dental and/or pain management procedures may be performed under:

- 1. Local and/or
- 2. Topical anesthesia
- 3. Intravenous anesthesia, and/or inhalation agents (including nitrous oxide).
- 4. Parenteral sedation
- 5. Regional anesthesia, and/or
- 6. Dissociative drugs (including Propofol)
- 7. General anesthesia

Propofol and agents 6 and 7 may be administered only by an anesthesiologist, an Anesthesia Assistant, a Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA) under physician supervision.

Class C facilities must meet all Class A, Class B, Class C-M, and Class C standards.
